### ***Over the last three years...***

- **Violent crime is spiking in Tippecanoe County**
- **Our county jail population has nearly doubled**
- **A dangerous drug epidemic has arrived from outside our county, specifically heroin and methamphetamine, and we now have a needle exchange program and a methadone clinic is opening this summer**

## ***Tippecanoe County is at a Crossroads...***

### **Jason Dombkowski's "Tough On Crime" Five Point Action Plan to REDUCE CRIME & INCREASE PUBLIC SAFETY as Sheriff:**

1. Assign Sheriff's Deputies to **existing task forces** which focus on drug dealers and smugglers
  - Assign Sheriff's Detectives to the Tippecanoe County Drug Task Force Detective Squad (DTF) again
  - Assign Patrol Deputies to the newly formed Tippecanoe County Highway Patrol Drug Interdiction Team (HIT)
  - Foster partnerships with local, state and federal law enforcement agencies for maximum effectiveness
  
2. Formation of a **Sex Crimes Task Force Unit** to address the significant increase in these crimes, specifically crimes against children; Detectives from multiple agencies would collectively work to solve these heinous crimes together
  
3. Increase **K9 Unit** resources and **K9** use, both on our county roadways and in the Tippecanoe County Jail to combat the flow of dangerous drugs into our neighborhoods

#### 4. Implement **Community Policing Practices & Programs**

- Assign deputies to work cooperatively with neighborhood associations, apartment complexes, mobile home communities and civic organizations to address crime concerns and quality of life issues
- Assign deputies to work with officials at each of our 19 TSC Schools to address specific safety concerns at each school
- Implement a DARE Program for all TSC 5<sup>th</sup> graders

#### 5. Implement **professional jail-based addiction treatment** programs to help people in crisis and to stop the revolving door of addiction in/out of our jail

- Reduces recidivism rates by half
- No tax payer money will be required, programs can be funded by court fees and commissary funds
